

CHILDREN IN CARE COUNCIL (CICC) MEETING SUMMARY | October 2017



LEISURE PASSES: The CiCC discussed the new and improved leisure passes to see which of the CiCC members had received them. The distribution of the leisure pass has reached a wide range of the CiCC members and those that have received their updated leisure passes confirmed their leisure passes were working like they were meant to and no more issues were raised. If you would like to receive your leisure pass please ask your foster carer, social worker or PA!

DRIVING LESSONS: The CiCC asked Medway Council what was to happen with the pilot scheme for driving lessons and Councillor Andrew Mackness and Interim Deputy Director Children and Adults' Services, Ann Domeney came upon the idea that they would liaise with each other to come up with a solution.

MEDWAY'S PLEDGE: Medway fed back to the CiCC that the pledge had progressed from a red colouring to an amber. This means that the CiCCs pledge to Medway Council is being worked on and the progress is ongoing. Medway Council have agreed to update us at every CiCC meeting. Ann Domeney agreed to look at the possibility of wifi becoming available in Supported Accommodation.

HEALTH APP: Karleigh, Sarah, Natalie and Kim worked together to come up with the idea of a new health app. They worked with each other to discuss the things that should be included within the app and asked the CiCC what their opinions of the idea of the app was. They have agreed to consult with a wider community of young people.

LAC REVIEWS IN SCHOOLS: the IRO team were looking at reviews not happening in schools as regularly as they currently do and looking at giving the young people the choice of where they wish for their reviews to be held.

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
