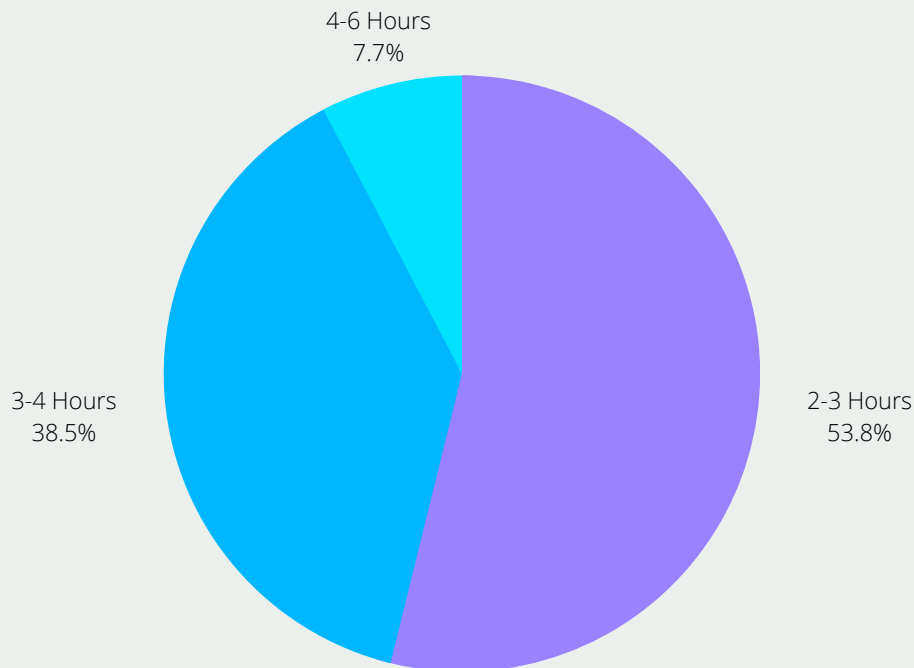

The service experienced a downturn this quarter due to the mandatory requirements of the National Transfer Scheme.

We also had the pleasure of welcoming 3 new volunteers to our team.

Voice of the Child



In line with the RRA consultation, this quarter we met with young people to gather their feedback on the accompanying adult service.

We translated our questionnaire into the 5 mainly spoke languages of our young people:-

Afghan Pashto (spoken in Afghanistan, Pakistan, Iran)

Albanian (spoken in Albania, Montenegro, Serbia)

Kurdish (spoken in Iraq, Iran, Kurdistan.)

Tigrinya (spoken in Ethiopia Iran, Iraq, Syria)

Arabic (spoken in 25 countries)

21 young people took part and were enthusiastic to complete the questionnaire. The results were mixed with most young people not really knowing or understanding the role of the Accompanying Adult.

This tells us that a lot more work needs to be done in this arena to inform and support these young people and to assist them in understanding how we, as a service, can support them.
