
157 requests

The service saw a slight decrease in demand this quarter.


The percentage male to female detainees remains consistent

Our youngest detainees supported were 11 years old. With the majority of arrests being in the 16 to 17 year old age group.




Vulnerability

Of the 157 juveniles supported by the service, 27 were recorded with disabilities including Communication, Mental Ill Health, Autism, Multiple/complex needs.

130 Juveniles did not have any declared disabilities.

These figures are consistent with previous quarters.

The service was requested **27** times for other requests such as rights only strip searches, bail returns and youth cautions.

New Services

New services are being introduced into Kent Police Custody.

As well as the Safe Havens we mentioned in our last quarter, we have now introduced a 24 hour helpline and a 24 hour text service.

The Coordinator is working with police teams to introduce these services into custody.

The purpose of attending is to ensure that Juvenile detainees are receiving the best service possible advice from all parties.
